Kehilat Chaverim invites you to join us for the 2016-2017 year.

Thanks to an all-volunteer group, we keep our dues structure affordable. A fundamental precept is the requirement that our members design, organize, staff, and run all of our programs. Kehilat Chaverim is an all-inclusive group that was established in 1978 as an alternative to a traditional synagogue. Services and events are held in members' homes and public locations. The group's over-arching goal is to provide an affordable and accessible community for people who wish to participate in Jewish culture and observance while offering support and friendship to one another throughout life's stages. The group comprises nearly 80 households and welcomes Jewish, interfaith, and LGBT couples and individuals. Ages range from young to ripe.

Activities

We offer High Holiday Services, Celebration of Jewish Holidays, Monthly Sabbath Services, Youth Education and Activities, Community Action, Social Activities, Education/Cultural Programs, and more. Many programs are the result of standing committees, while some are the result of member-generated interest.

This year, we will focus on building and reinforcing the connections among and between members and between Kehilat Chaverim and the broader community. The purpose of this focus on member and community "engagement" is to foster dialogue and relationships among members, strengthen community awareness of Kehilat Chaverim and outreach to potential members, and our awareness of and involvement with similar community-building initiatives in the local area that are focusing on sustaining Jewish congregations and organizations.

2016-2017 Committees

Jewish Life

Youth Education and Bar/Bat Mitzvah – Laura Pels* 860 667-1628

Helps plan and involve middle and high school students in community action projects, Jewish festivals and more. Will work with any families with Sunday School age children to try to find appropriate places for them to be educated. No youth Bar or Bat Mitzvot planned for this year. Working with adult members interested in becoming a Bar or Bat Mitzvah. We plan monthly meetings, which combine learning and familiarization with reading Biblical Hebrew, singing or saying Shabbat prayers, preparing a d'var Torah, choosing and designing Mitzvah projects with social action initiatives and educational programming focused on Jewish history, life, and culture.

Plans activities for Sukkot, Hanukkah, Purim and Passover. Social events include family programs and adult parties and theme nights. Past activities have included an Empty Bowls fundraiser, museum tours, theatre nights, sporting events, and a Purim costume party.

Develops and conducts monthly Sabbath services, usually on Friday evenings. Responsibilities include structure, content and leadership of services as well as shopping for refreshments and supplies, set-up and clean-up.

Focuses on building and reinforcing the connections among members, between members and Kehilat Chaverim, and between Kehilat Chaverim and the broader Jewish and non-Jewish community. The purpose of this focus on member and community “engagement” is to foster dialogue and relationships among members, strengthen community awareness of Kehilat Chaverim and outreach to potential members, and our awareness of and involvement with similar community-building initiatives in the local area that are focusing on sustaining Jewish congregations and organizations.

Through this focus on engagement, we’ll seek to learn more about members’ interests and needs, how we can respond to them by bringing people together around these similar concerns, needs, and interests, and how we can strengthen Kehilat Chaverim as a community, by creating “communities within our community” of membership connections and relationships. We’ll also continue our ongoing dialogue with other community organizations like the Mandell JCC and “Big Tent Judaism” (a national initiative focused on congregational revitalization and sustainability) to increase our visibility and our relationships with other groups as part of the larger Jewish community.
